

# George W. Bush: **PSYCHOPATHIC KILLER!**

MARK CRISPIN MILLER, THE *DYSLEXICON* author who studied George Bush's speech pathologies in detail, concluded that "Bush is a sociopathic personality. . .incapable of empathy. He has an inordinate sense of his own entitlement, and he's a very skilled manipulator." Miller would add, "He has no trouble speaking off the cuff when he's speaking punitively, when he's talking about violence, when he's talking about revenge. . .It's only when he leaps into the wild blue yonder of compassion and idealism, or altruism, that he makes these hilarious mistakes." In other words, Bush's inarticulateness arises from darker inadequacies than did Dan Quayle misspelling "potato."

Case in point: In September 2002, Bush was handed a script with the following: "Fool me once, shame on you, fool me twice, shame on me." What he actually mouthed was this: "Fool me once, shame...shame on you. [Long, uncomfortable pause.] Fool me — can't get fooled again!" The gaffe got a few laughs, but Miller observes, "What's revealing about this is that Bush could not say, 'Shame on me' to save his life. That's a completely alien idea to him."

Is Miller reading too much into this? Take a look at the twisted smirk on Bush's face when he talks about warfare in Afghanistan and Iraq. Also revealing: while preparing to declare the start of war against Iraq, he pumped his fist and said "Feels good." Or look At Donald "Redrum" Rumsfeld, his Secretary of Defense (who seems to be a caricature out of *Dr. Strangelove*.) Rummy used the word "kill" NINE TIMES during a THREE-MINUTE press conference, with disturbing glee. Consider the cruel treatment of Afghan POW's held at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, who have been filmed dressed up in kinky gear more suited to an S&M fantasy cruise.

The first signs of something wrong in little Georgie came when he was a child. In a May 21, 2000 *New York Times* puff piece, Nicholas D. Kristof quoted Bush's childhood friend Terry Throckmorton:

"We were terrible to animals,

"recalled Mr. Throckmorton, laughing, A dip behind the Bush home turned into a small lake after a good rain, and thousands of frogs would come out. 'Everybody would get BB guns and shoot them,' Mr. Throckmorton said. 'Or, we'd put firecrackers in the frogs and throw them and blow them up.'

Cut to his years as governor of Texas when he signed the death warrants of 154 prisoners in six years. In the entire history of the United States, no governor of any state has authorized more executions than Bush. Among the dead were Karla Faye Tucker, who became a born-again Christian while on death row. Bush refused to commute her sentence, despite an appeal for life from Pat Robertson, that would have made it politically viable. He would later mock her plea for life in a Talk Magazine interview. "Please don't kill me," he whimpered, his lips pursed in parody. The interviewer, Tucker Carlson (The Crossfire conservative and usually a political ally of Dubya) was so shocked by the warped gag that Bush stopped in mid-smirk. (Carlson's description of his facial expression) and took on a more serious veneer, suddenly realizing that he was behaving inappropriately.

Also among the snuffed: Gary Graham and David Wayne Spence, two men whose guilt is in serious doubt, and Betty Lou Beets, a 60-year old grandmother convicted of killing her chronically abusive husband. Bush did issue a solitary stay of execution to Ricky Nolen McGinn in June 2000, when questions about the accuracy of death penalty justice suddenly became a political issue for Mr. Compassionate Conservative. (Indeed, the *USA Today* article on the stay had this title: "Execution Stay Helps Compassionate Image.") McGinn was lethally injected, on September 27, with little media attention.

Oddly, the only person whose death sentence he did commute was Henry Lee Lucas, one of the most notorious serial killers, rapists, pedophiles and cannibals in U.S. history. (The movie: *Henry: Portrait of a Serial Killer* was loosely based on his exploits.) Bush's

supposed reason: "Henry Lee Lucas is unquestionably guilty of other despicable crimes [for] which he has been sentenced to spend the rest of his life in prison. However, I believe there is enough doubt about this particular crime that the state of Texas should not impose its ultimate penalty by executing him." Though there were questions about the murder Lucas was set to be executed for, (indeed, Lucas had originally confessed to over 600 murders, which seems somewhat unlikely), there are multiple murders he almost certainly did commit, as he claimed, in service of a well-financed Satanic cult. Further, as the Graham, Spence and Beets cases show, Bush chose to ignore serious doubts about others. Why the sudden compassionate conservatism about Lucas?

Whatever the reason, Dubya has shown little concern for the other deaths he has caused or facilitated, whether of U.S. soldiers, Afghan and Iraqi people, or death row inmates. And considering how his plans for the Middle East have backfired, he will likely become increasingly desperate. Desperate people with little compunction over killing are a very dangerous lot. In *The Dead Zone*, Stephen King describes a future president who begins nuclear Armageddon because of his unbalanced sociopathic nature. Of course, that was just a novel, and a far-fetched tale — in the prologue the future president kicks a dog to death.
