15 OCT 06. Hail John Paul! Thanks for your letter of 8 OCT 06 & the informative enclosures. Thanks, also, for the interesting questions. I don't know the present status of The French Foreign Legion. As far as I know, The Spanish Foreign Legion may be kaput, although it did play an important role in the Spanish Civil War from 1936 to 1939. The French Foreign Legion was made up of foreigners (officially) under French officers, for service in French colonies, although I seem to recall that units thereof were used in France during World Wars I & II. The last time I heard of French Foreign Legion activities was in Chad, against Libya, decades ago. The force may still exist, even after the demise of The French Empire, but vastly reduced in size. I heard no mention of it in regard to France's contribution of occupation troops in the former French colony of Lebanon, following the war between Israel & Hizbollah, so I don't know if it exists. The French Embassy or Consulate could tell us. I do not know if one can get French citizenship by serving in The French Foreign Legion, but it would seem likely. I knew several former French Legionnaires in Rhodesia, along with many veterans of other armies. The USA has a large force of military mercenaries in Iraq & elsewhere who allegedly get big zogbucks for doing what they did in such elite units as S.A.S., Special Forces & perhaps Spetznatz of the former Soviet Union. Regular grunt experience would also be suitable for qualification as a 'contractor.' I understand that the contractors take the same risks as do regular U.S. troops, but the make much more in pay.

As a side note, I recall seeing a recruiter in Brussels for Mike Hoare's Congo Mercenaries. I was sitting in a cafe with an English acquaintance & our two girlfriends when I noticed an elderly man who always sat at the same table, apparently studying a stamp collection. He was frequently approached by husky young men who'd chat with him for a moment & leave briskly. "What an odd bunch of stamp enthusiasts," I muttered to my friends. The Englishman knew what was going on: "Oh, he's recruiting for the Congo Mercenaries". It was late 1964, so their services were desperately needed to rescue Whites trapped in the former Belgian Congo, which was as unruly then as it is now. The time to ask about The French Foreign Legion is when you leave the ZOG gulag, for the times, they are a-changing, fast. A French correspondent informed me that some 30% of the current French armed forces are Moslem. Demographically, France is a colony of Algeria & other Moslem countries. When I was first in France, fighting was still going on in Algeria, which was still a French colony. A friend of mine, a German, was touring Europe in the early 1960s. He visited Marseilles, where he met a friendly Frenchman in a waterfront bar. The friendly Frenchman bought him drinks. The next thing my German friend knew was that he was on a ship, being bruskly wakened by a burly, nasty sergeant of The French Foreign Legion, who informed him that he'd signed up as a volunteer in Marseilles, so he was now a Legionnaire, on his way to war in Algeria. Talk about a rude awakening! My friend said he served 3 years, before he was able to leave. My experience conforms with that of others: when a military establishment doesn't need you, there's no way you can get in, but when they do need you, there's no way to stay out. The last thing I wanted to do was to resume any sort of military role, but there I was, overseeing my Black troops digging trenches around our position, which I was hastily fortifying, in the bright African sun.* Surprise! I stayed sober in Marseilles, so I did not join The Legion. Nor was I tempted to join The Spanish Foreign Legion in Spain. They had a nifty nickname: Los Novios de la Muerte, The Sweethearts of Death. Their slogan is not Semper Fidelis, but Viva la Muerte! (Long live Death!). I figured they must be a real bunch of swingers, so I stayed clear of them.

Aryan Nations apparently believed that Whites were the true jews & that those who said they were jews were fake. Christian Identity/Israel Identity & British Israel are different names for the same racket which was cooked up by British propagandists before World War I to split White people against their German kin. C.I., I.I. & B.I. claim that Angles & Saxons who left Germany became "Israelites" & those who stayed in Germany became "Judah." The first CI/II/BI propaganda I ever saw came from Her Majesty's Printing Office in London. I read that Pastor Kobert Miles, whom I knew, had the same knowledge as I do on the C.I. scam.
