Jean Lumb Awards recognize excellence in young Chinese Canadians

True to the memory of Chinese-Canadian trailblazer Jean Lumb, the four young recipients of the awards named in her honour are motivated, focused, and inspired.

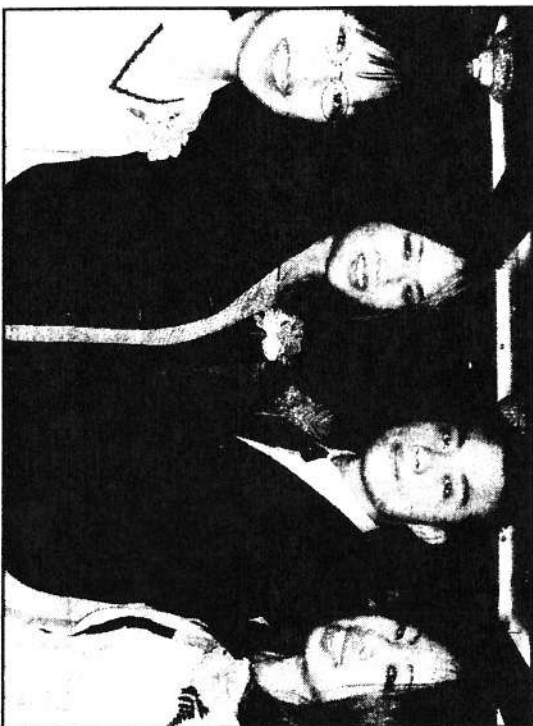
Those winners of the ninth annual Jean Lumb Awards were slightly overwhelmed by the gala dinner last night in Scarborough celebrating their outstanding high school achievements.

Excellence

Each year since 1998, the Jean Lumb Awards have rewarded high school students of Chinese descent for excellence in four areas: the arts, academics, athletics, and community service. The winners, who receive \$500 each, were feted in a packed dinner last night at a north Scarborough restaurant.

Last night's winners were Curtis Wang, 18, in arts, Pamela Lam, 18, for community service, Iain Kew Lee, 18, for athletics, and Jane Chui, 18, for academics.

Wang, an accomplished pianist

now studying life sciences at the University of Toronto after graduating from Upper Canada College this year, plans to go to medical school and continue his musical interests on the side.

Wang said the Jean Lumb

Awards are an inspiration for young Chinese Canadians.

"Generally, these kinds of awards serve to inspire and motivate young minds, and the entrepreneurs of tomorrow," he said.

Jean Lumb, the first Chinese-

Canadian woman to receive the Order of Canada, became known as the unofficial spokesman for the Chinese-Canadian community until her death in her 80s in 2002.

Legislation

Lumb was instrumental in changing the Chinese Exclusion Act, which heavily restricted Chinese immigration to Canada, as helping to preserve Chinatowns across the country. Along with her husband Doyle, she co-owned the Kwong Chow Chop Suey House at Dundas and Elizabeth Sts. from 1959 until 1981, her daughter Arlene Chan said last night.

Lumb accomplished all this after being forced to quit school at 16, while growing up in B.C. during the depression.

"She was a very, very positive person, and despite that setback, she went forward and never looked back. That was not her style — she was just very optimistic," said Chan, co-chairman of the awards' planning committee.
