Have you ever been to Russia? I am soon to be doing a supplemental issue on Russia and the changes since communism. Also I have an interview with the commander from an international organization that based out of Russia. An interesting group. They are the ones whom have been supplying some information about Russia to me as of late. Also much research on my part in encyclopedias and other information. This issue, similar to the issue on South Africa, I will be writing. It may take a bit/ will take a while! but it will be in the makings soon.

I am currently interested in finding a couple of groups/individuals with a somewhat large mailing list and offer to pay them expenses for doing mailings for me for Separate Living so that I may get some to new people. I've never been to Russia, as I was barred from all Soviet Bloc countries in 1969, including Castro Cuba. That ban merely confirmed the existence of the entity known as USA-USSR-ZOG & The Kosher Cold War Hoax. The Putin download is a good update on the battle between Zionist globalism & Nationalism.

Our continued stupidity & cowardice will insure that the crisis will be big, indeed, like a house fire which is left to burn, with the addition of buckets of gasoline thereon. If any Whites are left afterwards, we shall consider how much of a state we can make then, rather than imagine before they are prepared to do anything now.
