

22 MAR 08 Hail Sigrin! Many thanks for your thoughtful letter of 18 MAR 08. Ignorance is defined as "lack of knowledge." All ignorant people are cured by knowledge, just as all people are ignorant to some extent. Every day I like to learn something new, in order to cope better the next day. Stupid people cannot use knowledge, so stupid people are not just ignorant. There is no hope, whatsoever, for stupid people, as we learn, sooner or later.

We can learn from our own experience, & we can also learn from others, so as to avoid the hard knocks. I learned survival skills by watching others, who were here before me or who populated areas into which I came. I learned that one who drinks sufficient booze to fall off his chair teaches me that I could do exactly the same. Do I wish to pass out & fall off my chair? If the answer is "No," then I avoid doing what he did. I do not think I am 'special', as stupid people apparently do, so I won't repeat the drunk's experience. The same goes for all life's endeavors: Drive too fast; lose control & crash. How many times do we need to see evidence of this practice, before we learn? I only needed to see it once. A smart person learns fast, but a stupid one can see it over & over again & not make the connections, or he can pretend that "it won't happen to me," but it does. In a gambling casino, where I've worked, one can see that the odds are in favor of the house. That's why the house is in business. Hence, a gambler should not expect to win every time, nor in the next time. The fact that so many gamblers believe the rules of probabilities do not apply to them keeps the casinos in business & the gamblers broke.

Most Goyim (soulless cattle, according to the jews' definition) say: "But who am I to believe? One says one thing & another says another thing." We have the tradition of jury duty in this society, in which the jurors are "the triers of fact." The jury hears all sides to an argument, all or both of which are touted as "the truth," but it is up to the jury members TO USE THEIR MINDS. A good question to keep in mind is the ancient Roman one: "Cui bono?" (Who benefits?) Most ideologies include the principle that we should donate money to those who claim to represent such ideologies. Who benefits? The believers or the 'leaders'? That is our job to decide. Thanks be to ZOG, we now have zoggies posing as 'leaders', such as the ZOG agent-provocateur whom I mentioned.

The wise Chinese have a saying, that "the wrong man with the **right** plan = Disaster.
