Re German pronunciation: German is consistent, unlike English. Here are some tips: Sand is pronounced "zant." Strand as "shtrant." Nietzsche as "Nee-chu," as in "uh." Schul as "shool." Rothschild (Red Shield) as "rote-shilt." Volk as "folk." Weiss as vice. Zeit is pronounced as "tsite." EI is always "I." IE is always "ee." Unlike English, ^afinal "e" is pronounced as "uh." In the Army Language School we had fun with the difference between "schiesse" & "scheisse," in our sentry dialogs. Anglos don't distinguish the ei from the ie, so we'd often say, "Halt oder ich scheisse" (Halt or I'll shit!), instead of "Halt oder ich schiesse" (Stop or I'll shoot). Unlike English, German & French both have "umlauts" or dieresis, as in "Chloë," which, in English, means that the "e" is pronounced separately from the "o," as in "klo-ee." In German, the vowels are combined. Goering or Göring is pronounced as "Gering" in English. Hence, an oe or "o" = "er." A is pronounced "ah," e as "eh" or "uh," depending on word position; i as "ee" or i as in "itch." O is pen, as in "oh." U is "oo." Y as "i in it." A with umlaut, Ä, would be pronounced as "eh." German is phonetic, so we learned to read it out loud within 3 hours, even when we did not know the meaning of the words. We could also write them correctly, if we pronounced them correctly. German does not connect the words as in French or Spanish, even when the words are written together, as in Fallschirmjäger (paratrooper). A Schirm is a screen or shield, as in Regenschirm (umbrella). Schirm is pronounced "sheerm." Remember that the German V is pronounced as F & the W is pronounced as V. Foreign words approximate their original pronunciation, as in Sabotage: "Zahbotazh," although German consonants usually remain 'hard.' General is pronounced with a hard "g," as in "get," rather than a soft "g" as in "zhen," or "jen." J is pronounced like a "y" in English. A U-boat would be an Unterseeboot, pronounced as "oonterzehboat" in English. See = Sea or Lake, depending on size, as perceived by the viewer & namer. In the U.S. Army Language School, we had six teachers, so we wouldn't get anyone's personal accent. That was the best language course I ever had. We also had taperecordings to help with pronunciation. German pronunciation is "laut und deutlich," loud & clear. Otherwise, the speaker is accused of being drunk. All the best. ORION!
