Mel and Fred: Mel Gibson's film The Passion of the Christ was accused of 'anti-Semitism' for suggesting Jews killed the Christian god. "We didn't kill him - the Romans did!" as many editorials and columnists shrieked. True. Just as the Jews did not prosecute Dr Toben the Federal Court did. A fine line but a nicely legalistic one. What does the Bible say?

Luke 20.20: "[the Jewish chief priests and scribes] watched him and sent in spies who pretended to be righteous that they might seize on his words in order to deliver him to the authority of the governor". Every Rightist group is plagued with infiltrators. These are always very 'gung-ho' urging violence and incaution. Why? Like the chief priests spies that they might "deliver us" to government agencies for prosecution. 2,000 years but their tactics haven't changed - because they WORK.

Candidate Selection Processes: In 1960 Lyndon B. Johnson led in US Presidential Primaries for US Democratic Party. America uses 'primaries' instead of our secret Preselection Committees used by Australian political parties. Americans enjoy myth 'the people' play a role in candidate selection, unlike our faceless power-brokers. Our system lacks US hypocrisy but achieves same mediocrity.

LBJ & JFK: Lyndon B. Johnson was a former Congressman and Senate majority leader from poor, white, rural West Texas. Many in West Texas swore life-long fealty to LBJ after he got them tarmac roads and electricity. A liberal, LBJ was seen as too rural and Redneck for Democrats so lost Party nomination in 1960 to John F. Kennedy scion of a wealthy Boston family of Bootleggers from the Prohibition era.

Old Joe: JFK's father old Joe Kennedy had ambitions of being President but during his time as US Ambassador to England during the 1940 Blitz he backed Germany. British intelligence exposed him to the media and Joe was recalled in disgrace. The new rulers of America marked he and his family as permanent 'enemies'. They made sure old Joe would never be President.

Joe's Heirs: Undaunted, old Joe trained his eldest son, Joe Jur to be President. The US Army sent him on a suicide mission, as pilot of an experimental B17 'flying bomb'. So Old Joe set about training second son, JFK, as President. US Navy then sent him on a suicide mission, the famous PT-109 incident. After drifting at sea for days JFK was rescued but with a broken back. Old Joe made sure he was 'invalided' out of the military before they could make a second attempt on his life. Is no wonder mystery surrounds deaths of JFK and Joe's next candidate for President, Robert FK. RFK was also killed. Explains why Senator Teddy FK has never run for President. Those old Joe unwittingly opposed in 1940 now rule the world. Cross them and you may survive, but your family will not.

Right and Left: LBJ was champion of the Democrat Party Right and Kennedy of their Left. Neither could win alone but together they did. LBJ became US Vice-President, a post he later derided as "not worth a bucket of warm spit". It also carried a fatal flaw: although only 'a heart-beat away from power' only three former US Vice-Presidents had ever been elected to office in their own right. Rest inherited post after a Presidential assassination, as did LBJ. Many expressed surprise LBJ accepted 'poison chalice' of Vice-Presidency as it meant an end to his career as Senate power broker.

Death of JFK: Despite myth-making since his death, JFK was deeply un-popular. By 1963 he was warned not to visit Texas, LBJ's home state and power-base as his life would be in danger. Yet Texas, along with California and New York, are the three key states that must be won to secure the Presidency. 1964 was an election year and Congress had blocked JFK's Ultra-Left legislation.

LBJ Becomes JFK: JFK visited Texas and died there. LBJ was sworn in as President, then shocked many by reversing his previous Rightist stance. LBJ used his influence as former Senate majority leader to 'un-block' the blocked legislation. Is alleged LBJ had 'dirt' files on every member of Congress and used these to blackmail compliance with JFK's wishes. Many 'civil rights' [equal opportunity] laws US now suffers under were proposed under JFK but forced through under LBJ. Screen of 'Left and Right' politics merely disguised SYSTEM players who control both.

JFK's Legacy: Media eulogies of JFK over past 40 years border on the hysteric: an affair with Marilyn Monroe, connections with the Mob, death of his brother RFK, his widow Jackie Onassis. Yet JFK's 'finest' achievements were the Bay of Pigs invasion and Cuban Missile Crisis. Both were slated to go the other way.

Cold War, Secret War: JFK entered office in 1961. Found himself at centre of a secret war begun under President General Eisenhower between CIA and USSR. 'Cold' War was very hot, but mainly fought by allies of each empire, never directly by their own troops. In 1958 General Eisenhower asked CIA to overthrow Leftist Trujillo government in Domician Republic, neighbouring Haiti. They did.

Coups Made Easy: Method was simple. 'Rebels' trained in US were covertly dropped on coast by US Navy to set up radio station proclaiming a 'free zone'. US-trained agents in trade unions, student organisations and armed forces would undermine target government. When nation was paralysed by strikes and mutinies, rebels would declare themselves a Provisional Government and demand foreign 'recognition' which US would give. First request of new 'government': US Marines to assist in 'restoring order'. Legal government, as in Iraq and Afghanistan since, were declared 'rebels' and shot on sight. American forces had saved another fiefdom for 'democracy'. That was the method in the Cold War. As late as March 2004 identical method was used to overthrow Leftist Aristide in Haiti and Charles Taylor in Liberia.

Bay of Pigs: Unfortunately for the Cuban exiles of Battalion 4506 Eisenhower left office before the coup against Castro took place. Successor JFK was like Castro a proxy of Moscow but under deep cover. JFK's dilemma: how to halt Cuban coup but without leaving 1,100 heavily armed and angry Cuban Ultra-Rightists loose in America. He devised a plan that would save both himself and Castro.

Fatal Betrayal: So JFK allowed CIA's invasion force to go ahead with a twist. On 16th April 1961 Cuban Rightists secured a bridgehead at the Bay of Pigs, as planned, then called for US Marine support. This was denied. White House had intervened ordering no support be given. US Navy sat offshore and watched as the troops they had just landed were captured and killed. No one told the rebel's 'Cuban Air Force' so these continued to bomb and strafe Castro's army till all were shot out of the sky. Their desperate courage was futile in the face of American treachery. By 17th April 1961 it was all over.

Cuban Missile Crisis: Abandoning Cuba's Rightists to tender mercies of Castro's KGB trained secret police showed JFK's true position. When Castro realised he had an ally in the White House he felt safe to drop the sham of 'social democracy'. Castro openly declared himself and Cuba to be Marxist. Later same year Castro felt safe enough to invite USSR military to site nuclear missiles in Cuba and from there to threaten much of the USA. USSR later claimed they were only responding to a JFK provocation, the basing of US nukes on their border in Turkey. In fact JFK was happy to have USSR missiles dominating America. US military were not.

Media Spin: US Air Force leaked word of the Cuban missiles to sympathetic reporters amongst the otherwise pro-Left US media. Leftist media then had to put a pro-JFK spin on what could only be either an embarrassing CIA failure or a total sell-out by the Kennedy Administration.

<u>IFK Brinkmanship</u>: JFK was a skilled politician albeit an unprincipled one. Once the story of the missile was leaked he decided to brazen it out. He told the US public their was nothing they could do. They would simply have to accept USSR missiles permanently deployed within easy range of most major US cities. The Cold War could then end and JFK would devote his country's funds to building socialism in one country: welfare, civil rights, education. All the usual Democrat issues.

US Air Force Coup? Unfortunately for JFK and his Leftist cronies the US military intervened. As revealed in British video Baiting The Bear USAF Strategic Air Command founder/commander General Curtis Le May ordered his Deputy Commander to issue the 'go codes'. These would signal the commencement of nuclear air strikes on the USSR. The 'go' was issued 'in the clear', i.e. un-coded. Russian intelligence Colonel Serov revealed in 1995 the GRU knew exactly what the US generals were up to. "They sent the orders uncoded so we could hear them and retreat from Cuba". It worked. Cuba lost their missiles. USSR was embarrassed worldwide. Soviet Premier Krushchev was overthrown soon after in a palace coup (p. 277 Edward Crankshaw Krushchev London: Sphere Books 1966). Kennedy was forced to continue expensive Cold War. JFK was saved by media spin that made a traitor into a hero.

Payback: Being a good socialist JFK knew how to take revenge. The two USAF generals were quickly 'retired' and SAC disbanded. No US President would ever again have to face a rebellious military. Just to be sure JFK started a real shooting war in VietNam. This would kill lots of US troops who, like the Cuban exiles of Brigade 2506, had become a threat to JFK's socialist plans at home. The war was deliberately fought to be lost.

Anti-Militarism: A long Asian land war, with a slow build up, soon bogged down and with no 'exit strategy' was just what JFK needed. This would discredit the military in the eyes of the US public neutralising any future generals with political ambitions. Treatment given President Reagan's Secretary of State General Alexander Haig and NSC adviser Colonel Oliver North are examples of US media hatred of military in politics. Not till General Colin Powell became Secretary of State in 2000 did this animosity abate.

Anti-System Systemites: Leftist anti-war protesters aimed their anger not at JFK's government but directly at the US military. Professional 'student' militants like Abraham 'Abby' Hoffman and Jeremiah 'Jerry' Rubin were useful tools of both the US System and USSR as neither wanted a US victory.

<u>Diem</u>: Unfortunately for JFK South Vietnam did not want any help from US troops. Their President Diem, like JFK a Roman Catholic, had the Viet Cong totally under control (pp. 107 & 113 Denis Warner Not With Guns Alone London: Hutchison 1977). JFK needed a war so Diem's repeated refusals could only end one way: in death, Ironically, four weeks after JFK had Diem and his brother Nhu, head of the secret police and Cao Dong (Revolutionary Workers Party), murdered JFK himself was killed. System had its war. Was time for JFK to serve them as a martyr. In his name US Congress would now pass all the laws they had opposed while he lived.

Hollywood Proof: Some may dispute idea JFK planned to sell-out US over Cuban missiles when stopped by Rightist US generals. But Hollywood provides plenty of proof. Hollywood's Establishment are no friends of the Right and were voluble in their support of JFK, both alive and dead. Have eulogised his vision of 'Camelot' in film, TV and documentaries. How could they provide proof of our theory? Like all alien ruling castes they fear and loathe those they rule.

Anti-Military Films: In 1964 three films were released in which US Air Force generals 'go mad' and threaten the USSR with a muclear first strike. Fail-Safe was a drama starring noted Leftist Henry Fonda as US President and Larry Hagman as National Security Adviser. Stanley Kubrick then made a satire of Fail-Safe. Dr Strangelove or How I Overcame My Fear and Came to Love The Bomb had to be made in England as no one in Hollywood would provide finance. Many only know of Dr Strangelove for Peter Sellars multiple roles including one of Dr Werner Von Braun. Few remember Fail-Safe. Third 'mad general' film of 1964 is Seven Days in May has Burt Lancaster carrying out a coup against the US President.

No VietNam Films: One notable feature of Hollywood's treatment of the VietNam war is its absence from the screen. A great silence. From 1962, when US troops first arrived, till 1978 no films about the war were made. Boys of Company C appeared in 1978 from Run Run Shaw's Golden Harvest Co in Hong Kong. But not till 1979 and Francis Ford Copppola's Apocalypse Now did an American attempt a film on the VietNam War. Contrast this mute treatment of an anti-Communist war with the deluge of WWII films, books and documentaries even 60 years after the war ended.

OTQ9 TV News 11am Tuesday 13 April 2004:

Iraq: US general John Abazaid said today "the main aim of Coalition forces in Iraq is to capture or kill Muqtadr Al Sadr". Week of fighting across Iraq has left 70 Coalition troops and over 700 Iraqis dead.

[US contradicts itself in Iraq. Says it came to overthrow 'dictator' Saddam. Then says it came to impose 'democracy' yet whenever a leader emerges they order him 'captured or

killed'. Someone should give US a history lesson. Either they want a democratic leader for Iraq, chosen by its own people or they want a puppet. Why all the lies? 'Democracy' in Iraq is latest example of the farce this method of rule has become. Leaders like Pauline Hanson (Australia) and Pym Fortyn (Holland) arise but are captured (Pauline) or killed (Pym). Same hand is at work in West as in Iraq. Defeat these dogs in Iraq means their defeat worldwide. RE.

BBC World Service 'Business Report' c/- 87.1FM 6.40am Saturday 17 April 2004:

Reporter Owen Bennett-Jones interview with Rosemary Hollis of Royal Institute for International Affairs and Professor Juan Kohl(?) University of Michigan on British Prime Minister Tony Blair's current visit to White House to discuss future Iraq policy.

Juan Kohl: "America has wanted a secure military base in the Middle East since British left in 1969. Middle East has been a source of concern to US Administrations for 30 years. Is source of 2/3 of world's oil. They need a base there to protect their oil interests. Now they have a base — in Iraq. Iraq currently ties down ½ the US armed forces. They want to scale that back to one division, 20 000 men. They'll be there forever — as in Japan and South Korea".

Rosemary Hollis: "US would be wrong to go into Najaf [after Al Sadr]. They went into Fallujah after killing of four civilian contractors. They went in bent on vengeance. Only after 600 Iraqis were killed did someone manage to reign them in. US talks about democracy but rejects any role for Islamic parties in Iraq. [US academic] Ken Adelman says it has to be their kind of democracy and if it isn't they will pummel people until they get what they want".

Juan Kohl on future of Achmed Chalabi, current head of the Iraqi Governing Council: "US policy over Iraq has been a contest between State Department and Defence Department. Chalabi is a favourite of Defence backed by Donald Rumsfeld, Wolfowitz and Douglas Feith. But Chalabi's star is falling. He hasn't been able to put together a credible administration. He hasn't brought peace". [Ironic for Blair. Was a British Labor government that quickly exited Aden Protectorate in 1969 after locals staged a brief uprising (pp. 114--115 H.P.Willmott 'Cyprus & Aden' Sir Robert Thompson (Ed.) War in Peace: An analysis of warfare since 1945. London: Orbis, 1981). Aden, on tip of Arabian Peninsula, was essential to guarding Western-bound supertankers. Pro-Soviet British Labor happily handed it to Soviet lackeys. Aden became South Yemen. Later swallowed by North Yemen, a Soviet client state. Kohl's remark is hint to British not to weaken this time in face of Third World savagery. RE].

BBC World Service c/- SBS Radio 87.1 FM 6.10am Sunday 18 April 2004:

Gaza: One month after killing HAMAS spiritual leader Sheik Yassin Israel has killed his replacement Abdul Aziz Rantissi. Both died in helicopter missile attacks. Mr. Rantissi had only minutes before left his home by car. Israel's Foreign Ministry spokesman Jonathan Peled issued a statement saying they "cannot fail to be pleased". Only three days ago US President George Bush met Israel's Prime Minister Ariel Sharon at the White House to endorse an Israeli pullout from Gaza Strip. Sharon's plan would leave Gaza's one million people sealed off from the world. Has lead to a massive outpouring of despair by Palestinians resulting in two massive HAMAS demonstrations. Palestinian Prime Minister Qureia says Rantissi death was a direct result of "American encouragement".

Madrid: Spain's new Leftist government has 50% female representation in its first Cabinet.

Kosovo: Three members of International Police Force in Kosovo have been killed and eleven others wounded in a shoot-out amongst themselves. Two Americans and a Jordanian died following an argument over Iraq.

Deutsche Welle TV The Journal c/- Briz 31 Community TV 11am Sunday 18 April 2004:

Gaza: Israel has killed HAMAS leader Abdul Aziz Rantissi in a missile attack on his car. Had survived a previous Israeli missile attack on his car in June 2003. A paediatrician, Dr. Rantissi and Sheik Yassin were among seven original founders of HAMAS in 1987. Israel vowed to kill all HAMAS leaders following perceived lack of response to killing of Sheik Yassin. Like most HAMAS leaders Yassin and Rantisi lived in exile till 1993 Peace Accord drew them home.

[And within range of Mossad's assassins. Be wary of enemies talking 'peace'. Only peace is in the grave. RE].

Mitrovica: Three members of the International Police Force for Kosovo were killed and eleven wounded in shoot-out at Mitrovica prison. Two of the dead police were American women. Among 20 police at the prison they were part of a contingent of 100 International Police recently arrived in this mainly-Albanian Muslim town. Four Jordanian police officers were later arrested.

Presenter Jana Wendt: "Mel Brookes' The Producers opened in Melbourne's Prince's Theatre last night". Mel was on hand for opening night. Show stars Australia's top stage actors Bert Newton and Tom Burlinson with Reg Livermore in the lead as Max Bialystok. Brookes co-wrote popular film comedies Frankenstein starring Gene Wilder, Blazing Saddles starring Harvey Korman and Get Smart TV series. The Producers, subtitled Springtime For Hitler—a neo-Nazi Musical, was first filmed in 1964 starring Zero Mostel and Gene Wilder. Was re-launched on Broadway in New York following 9-11. When asked why he wrote an anti-Hitler musical Brookes then commented "if you have an enemy you ridicule them and Hitler was one of the biggies".

ABC News Radio 936AM 10.30am Monday 19 April 2004:

Bagdad: US Administrator in Iraq Paul Bremer says Iraqi forces alone will be unable to retain law and order after the June 30 pull-out of US forces. 99 US troops have been killed so far this month and 50 foreign hostages taken by Iraqi elements.

ABC News Radio 936AM 10.30am Monday 19 April 2004:

Charleston, South Carolina: Today marked the end of a week-long celebration of the *Hunley*, world's first submarine to sink an enemy vessel. The Confederate warship was discovered four years ago but the eight-man crew's remains were not buried till today. Vessel itself is now on display in a tank at a disused US Navy base. Variously known as the *Hunley*, the CS Hunley and the HL Hunley it sank in 1864 soon after sinking a US Navy frigate blockading Charleston harbour.

BBC World Service c/- SBS Radio 87.1FM Thursday 22 April 2004:

Basra: Five simultaneous car-bombs targeting police facilities have killed 68 and wounded over 100 in the mainly Shiite South, a British-controlled area. Three bombs exploded at police stations and two at Zubair Iraqi police academy outside Basra. Locals believe bombers were not Shiite. Among dead are a mini-bus full of school children, 20 of whom died.

Fallujah: US Marine Corp helicopter gun-ships besieging this Sunni town killed nine 'militants' after they refused to hand over their weapons. Several civilians also died.

Riyad: Four people were killed and 10 injured by a car-bombing at the central police HQ of the Saudi capital. Bomb killed Saudis alone. Usually such attacks have targeted foreigners. Is first time Saudis have been the target. Al Qaeda recently issued a statement that "to kill Saudi security officials in their homes would be a very easy thing". Saudi officials admit they uncovered five other carbombs in the city in the past week.

Reporter Andrew North, Kabul: 600 people have died across Afghanistan in past eight months in renewed violence by the Taliban, Al Qaeda "and another group".

SBSTV News 6.30pm Thursday 22 April 2004:

Washington: Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff General Meyers has told Congress the US will retain 20,000 troops in Iraq after the 30th June 'pull-out'. "The bulk of these will comprise the 1st Armoured Division" he said. US Occupation of Iraq currently costs AUD\$6.4 billion per month. An additional budget may have to be sent to Congress.

New York: UN has admitted several officials overseeing its 'Oil for Food' programme in Iraq took "millions of dollars" in 'kick-backs' from Saddam Hussein's regime. Will appoint a commission of inquiry headed by former US Federal Reserve Board Chair Paul Volkers and including former South African judge Justice Goldstone.

[Talk about setting a thief to catch a thief! Volkers and Goldstein. One sold out America and the other white South Africa. RE].

BBC World Service c/- SBS Radio 87.1FM 5am Friday 23 April 2004:

Bagdad: US Army general Dempsey today gave an assessment of the 'reliability' of newly-created, US-led Iraqi security forces. During the current 'militia uprising' "50% stood tall, 40% walked off the job and 10% fought against us".

BBC World Service c/- SBS Radio 87.1FM 6.20am Saturday 24 April 2004:

Reporter Olenka Frankel, Pyongyang: "North Korean survives because of extreme social stratification. When we asked officials in the capital if they had been to the country to see the stunning landscape they react with horror. 'The country?!' To them it is like Siberia. You are only sent there for being a criminal. Everyone wants to get to the capital. Only there is there electricity and some cars".

ABC News Radio 936AM 6.45am Monday 26 April 2004:

Harvard academic and psychologist Howard Gartner(?) on his new book: Changing Minds – the Art and Science of Changing our minds and Others. Gartner says there are seven levers to 'mind change'. These include Reward; Resonance; Redescriptions; Real world events; Resistance.

Gartner: "With resonance things just 'feel right'. Redescription is saying the same thing over and over but in different ways – through words, jokes, films, TV. Real world events – these are things you don't make happen but you can take advantage of. Like 9-11. The government didn't make it happen but it was a good excuse for attacking Iraq.

"Resistance or counter-beliefs are seen in fundamentalism, i.e. where someone makes a commitment not to change their mind. The only cure for these is adolescence – half all fundamentalists quit as teenagers, i.e. they agree to change their minds. 80% of Americans say evolution is 'only a theory'. We believe it is US fundamentalism that prevents more believing in evolution. I myself am a scientific fundamentalist. I refuse to believe in spirits or magic.

"Margaret Thatcher was a great mind changer. She did this through story-telling. She embodied the stories. Gaining two university degrees while living above her father's shop, standing firm in the Falklands War, surviving the Brighton Hotel bombing. Her life gave her stories credibility. In the US Newt Gingrich was also a great mind-changer through stories but only for a while as his life did not reflect what he was saying. He talked of 'term limits' yet continued to run for office. He criticised Big Government but had never worked anywhere else. He spoke of Family Values but ran out on two wives. He finally lost all credibility".

Kabul: Afghan President Hamid Karzai has invited moderate members of the former Taliban regime to join his government.

Bagdad: Two suicide speed-boats attempt to destroy Iraqi offshore oil facilities.
