ABC Radio National 936AM 6pm 8 September 2005: Reporter Stephanie Kennedy, Canberra: Australia's new anti-terrorism laws have come into effect. Prime Minister John Howard denies Australia is now a "quasi-police state". New measures increase powers to stop and search and power to detain suspects for up to 14 days without charge. Courts may now order terrorism suspects to wear tracking device for up to 12 months and it is now a criminal offense to leave a bag "unattended".

BBC World Service c/- SBS Radio 93.3 FM 5.45am Friday 9 September 2005: Two hundred Mexican Army troops crossed US border to assist in clean-up efforts following Hurricane Katrina. Is first time Mexican troops have entered the US in 150 year. [Like scene from *Day after Tomorrow*: US population beg entry to Mexico as 'refugees' after ice sheet envelopes North. RE].

BBC World Service c/- SBS Radio 93.3 FM 5.45am Friday 9 September 2005: British Home Secretary Jack Straw has urged EU to begin accession talks immediately for Turkey to enter. Said: "Turkey's entry will send a signal that Eastern and Western cultures can co-exist". Warned failure to allow Turkey in "would have ramifications too terrible to contemplate". [British Interior Minister is an hysterical wimp. Doesn't serve Britain's interests. Turkey is close military ally to Mid-East terror-state with reputation for death squads and rule by assassination. Straw is one of these self-chosen. RE].

For second night in a row Israeli troops guarding abandoned settlement in Gaza Strip shot dead a Palestine youth said to be one of a group cutting hole in security fence. [Abandoned house worth more than a life. Explains inhumane ZOG rule. RE].

SBS Radio World View 93.3 FM 6am Friday 9 September 2005: Australia's new anti-terrorism laws came into effect today. Prime Minister John Howard denies Australia is now a "quasi-police state". New measures include increased powers to stop and search, the power to detain suspects for up to 14 days without charge. Courts may now order terrorism suspects to wear tracking device for up to 12 months. Is now a criminal offense to leave a bag "unattended". People holding dual citizenship may now be stripped of their Australian citizenship if convicted of terrorism-related offenses.

Melbourne Jewish community leaders say they are concerned about presence of former member of Hungarian Arrow Cross Movement in their city. Janos Polgar is a former adviser to the ARCM leader who briefly ruled Hungary for Nazis in 1944. Polgar is held responsible for deportation of 35,000 Jews to Auschwitz and now lives in Melbourne. [SBS let's 'cat out of the bag'. 'Terrorists' don't lose citizenship, anti-Semites like Polgar do. For many years ZOG demanded Australia copy US and reduce citizenship to a popularity poll, denied some and removed from others. Under British-based Constitution was impossible. Till now. How about former ARCM members complain to Federal government about number of Semites in 'their city'? Deport these whiners. Don't be their attack-dog. No Jews, no anti-Semitism. A simple formula. Channel Ten *Totally Wild* 7.15am Saturday 10 September 2005 (15minutes): Scientist Chris Burwell:

"Weaver ants found high in trees of tropical Far North Queensland attack as a group. When an ant finds a larger insect he tethers it to a leaf till other ants arrive. They then subdue it and remove it to their nest. Weaver ants don't sting but bite, pierce flesh then inject a poisonous irritant. Are called 'weaver ants' because they 'weave' their nests using gum. Adult workers cannot produce this gum. Only larvae do, from their heads. So when two leaves need to be gummed together workers retrieve a larvae from the nest. Then rub its head up and down between two leaves till it is 'exhausted'. Then collect another and continue the process till complete". ['exhausted'? Weaver ants unite to battle foes many times their size. Expend weak for common good. Whites must learn from Nature. RE].

BBC World Service c/- SBS Radio 93.3 FM 4am Tuesday 13 September 2005:

Reporter Daniel Lack, Gaza: "Thousands of Palestinians have flooded into 21 abandoned Jewish settlements on Gaza Strip. Already noise, traffic jams and daily hustle and bustle of Palestinian 'street' is here. Children rushed to the sea, something they had never seen before as settlers had controlled the beaches. In several settlements synagogues were burned. Masked gunmen from Palestinian militant group HAMAS said they saw Israeli pull-out as their victory, due entirely to their efforts. Palestinian legislator Hanna Ashrawi said it was good to be free of the constant bombings, shootings and artillery.

Reporter Christopher Morris, Jerusalem: In Israel there was anguish that synagogues were burned in Gaza. They had expected this but still there were tears.

SBSTV *Cutting Edge: 'Combatant's Letter'* 8.30pm Tuesday 13 September 2005 (55minutes):

Director Shiri Tsaur, producer Avi Banon. Interviews some of 100-plus Israeli Defence Force 'refuseniks', Reservists who refuse to do their annual 30 days national service in 'Occupied Territories' [Palestine]. Lead by Captain David Zonshein these 'deserters' signed a letter refusing to serve in 'the Territories' as they saw continued "repression, brutality, violence and murder as destroying the IDF and Israeli society". Zonshein explained why he refuses. "It was at the village of Dir Dibwan near Nablus. I had taken my unit on a routine arrest with two agents from Shabak (secret police). We entered a house and found a man, his wife and seven children. Agents took the man into the next room and told us to 'wreck the house to show them not to mess with the IDF'. They began to beat the man. Really unbelievable stuff. Elbow to the teeth, kicking the testicles, kicking side of the knees to break them...everything. This was routine. I ask: 'is this man a terrorist?' No, he has a rifle'. 'Was he planning on using it against us?' 'No, he just has it'. After an hour the man talks. He informs on his cousin. Takes us to cousin, a shepherd boy, no more than 14 years old. We send the man back to his wife and seven kids. The two agents begin to beat the 14 year old. Unbelievable. They crush his testicles for a long time. They 'flip' his head doing it for half an hour. They beat him for two hours. He gradually becomes unresponsive. When we left him he was like a pile of rags. I

believe he died. Now I thought nothing of that. It was nothing. Just a routine mission. It took me years to even remember it happened. That's why I'm sleepless now. You could say I'm atoning".

Another 'refusenik' tells his tale of regret: "we went on an arrest with two agents. We surrounded the house, were on top of it, behind it. We went in. What I remember is the silence. We went room to room. No one said anything. We were shown a boy, maybe 10 years old, the agent said: 'take him' so we did. He was driven away. We walked back to camp, nearby. I told my commander. It wasn't anything unusual. Just one of many stories. I tried to sleep later but my C.O. played a trick on me. He came up to my sleeping bag, pulled it down, looked me in the face and shouted: 'NAZI!' A standard joke".

Zonshein again: "we do not know what French soldiers in Algeria thought or South African soldiers or soldiers from that historical situation with which no comparisons are allowed...all these thought they were doing right". ["that historical situation with which no comparisons are allowed..."? Even in Israel Nazi Germany is a taboo topic. RE].

BBC World Service c/- SBS Radio 93.3 FM 6am 15 September 2005: Reporter Rebecca Morris: 40% of India's new HIV cases are rural women. Given wide-spread illiteracy the first many of them know of AIDS is when they are diagnosed with it.

BBC World Service c/- SBS Radio 93.3 FM 'Looking For Democracy' 5am-5.30am Tuesday 20 September 2005: Presenter Robin Lustig. A programme for the Open University.

Orange County, California: "Here 1/3, maybe even 1/2 the population are illegals from 'South of the border'. They do the work but cannot vote. Till now. A massive programme is underway to encourage all illegals to become citizens. When asked why they risk being deported after 10-15 years here just to get a vote they often reply: 'we think it is time California had a Latino governor'. Elections are everywhere in America, even for judges. Isn't that counter-intuitive? Can you expect someone to judge impartially when they have been elected by partisan forces? At least one California judge sees no problem - at least not in California. 'But in Illinois recently,' she said, 'a judge was elected to their Supreme Court with a US\$10 million war chest. Implication is clear. Those who elect him expect 'pay-back', preference when deciding commercial law in Chicago'".

Basra: British and Iraqi military officials deny there is any "crisis" in their relationship after British forces launched an assault against an Iraqi government position to free two of their colleagues held prisoner there.

Channel Seven TV News 4.45pm Wednesday 21 September 2005: In Southern Iraq today British forces are explaining why two of their troops held hostage were first held in an Iraqi police cell then a nearby house. Appears some recruits to New Iraqi Police force in the South are in fact members of extremist Shiite militia, MADHI ARMY. Unlike Sunni militants to the North these do not pursue open warfare but simply seek a time-table for eventual withdrawal of all foreign forces from Iraq.

Channel Seven TV *Beyond Tomorrow* 7.30pm Wednesday 21 September 2005 (50 minutes): Melbourne: Inventor Angelo Dipietro spent 30 years developing an engine that runs on compressed air. Next model will weight just six kilos, half current model. Orbital engine has few moving parts, unlike a conventional piston engine. Conventional engines waste most of the power they produce on themselves or their gear-boxes. As orbital engine has neither all its energy is translated into power. Two-minute burst of compressed air is enough to keep the Dipietro engine going for two hours. Angelo hopes to convert Melbourne Fruit Market fleet of gas- and petrol-driven fork-lifts to his engines "soon".

BBC World Service c/- SBS Radio 93.3 FM 'World Briefing' 5.19am Saturday 24 September 2005:

A bomb has exploded at a West Bank rally for Palestinian militant group HAMAS. Ten people are reported killed.

As Hurricane Rita approached US coast two million people in Texas were evacuated. Mexico says it has evacuation sites for Texas refugees from Rita, many of whom are of Mexican origin. Says it has medical facilities as well as accommodation.

ABCTV (US) *Today* 7.5pm Saturday September 2005 c/- Channel Seven TV 5.15am Saturday September 2005:

Israel killed three members of Islamic Jihad in West Bank, first deadly action since total evacuation of Gaza settlements.

500,000 people in Louisiana, already homeless from Hurricane Katrina, have been ordered to flee Hurricane Rita. New Orleans is expecting 3.5 inches of rain from Rita today as it approaches the coast.

BBC World Service c/- SBS Radio 93.3 FM 'Looking for Democracy' 5.20am Saturday 24 September 2005: Reporter Robin Lustig, Kampala interviews Ugandan President Yoweri Museveni:

RL: "You previously banned political parties from elections but this year's election allows them. Some say it is due to pressure from Western donor nations". YM: "No. In the West you had a middle class. These gave rise to parties. But our previous parties, inherited at Independence, were all 'sectarian'. Catholics would not cooperate with Protestants. This was unworkable. But after many years rule by me this situation no longer holds".

RL concludes: "After my 35,000 mile journey around the world 'in search of democracy' I have discovered three things: Elections are not democracy. Bahrain, Cambodia and Santa Ana, California have plenty of elections but no democracy. Democracy cannot be exported. Only if, like in Ukraine, there is a grassroots movement ready and waiting to assist its birth. Essence of 'democracy' is the ability to say what you want and to hold your political representatives accountable".

BBC World Service c/- SBS Radio 93.3 FM 'World Briefing' 5am Tuesday 27 September 2005:

Arabic TV Network *Al Jazeera* have condemned a court in Spain which sentenced one of their reporters to seven years for

'cooperating with Al Qaeda' calling it an 'attack on press freedom'. Seven others were gaoled, including the group's leader who received 27 years for 'assisting in the September 11 attack in New York'.

Reporter Caroline Hawley, Bagdad: Five Shiite Primary school teachers and their driver have been executed near Iskandariyah, South of Bagdad. Classes had just ended when men dressed as Iraqi National Police drove up and herded the six into a classroom where they were shot. The Sunni school Principal was spared.

BBC World Service c/- SBS Radio 93.3 FM 'Business Report' 5.10am Tuesday 27 September 2005:

With Peter Day: "Merchant Banker's Goldmans Sachs' economist Jim O'Neill has authored a report saying by 2050AD the G7 will be overtaken by the BRICs - Brazil, Russia, India and China. US will be nowhere. BRIC has 2.7 billion people yet only 1/2 US's GDP. This world is a more complex place than the economists believe".

SBSTV World News Australia 6.30pm Tuesday 27 September 2005:

Reporter Gabby Hills: Court in Spain sentenced 18 suspects to gaol terms as alleged 'co-conspirators' with Al Qaeda over 9-11 attack in US. Ring leader Abu Dada, said to held a meeting with Mohamed Atta leader of the 9-11 attacks in July 2001, received 27 years. *Al Jazeera* TV reporter Tahzir Aluni was sentenced to seven years. Aluni is notorious for his exclusive interview with Al Qaeda leader Osama bin Laden soon after 9-11 attacks. Spanish spokesman for *Al Jazeera* TV Lamis Adoni said they "deeply regret" the sentence. Spain is the only country, after Germany, to put anyone on trial over 9-11 attacks. [System 'justice' is spiteful and vindictive. Gaol Aluni simply for reporting bin Laden. Is lesson to world media: report only N.W.O. lies or suffer consequences. RE].

Reporter Caroline Hawley, Bagdad: "20-30 bodies turn up at City morgue daily, victims of violence. Sunni-Shiite sectarian tensions rising daily many see the daily death-toll as a sign people are now being killed for not for who they are but what".

COAG (Council Of Australian Governments) agreed to uniform anti-terrorist laws across all States and Territories. Federal government successfully sought increased powers for police to stop and search, to detain suspects without charge for 14 days, to require a tracking device be worn for up to 12 months. Eight ALP Premiers forced inclusion of a 'sunset clause'. [SBS Radio earlier reported ALP Opposition Leader Kim Beazley had tried to 'out tough' the Federal Liberals by demanding police have the power to seal off whole suburbs during terror sweeps. Was ignored. RE].

BBC World Service c/- SBS Radio 93.3 FM 'Business Report' 5.40am Thursday 29 September 2005:

Reporter Duncan Bartlett: Russian government has purchased energy giant Gazprom from Roman Abrahamovich for US\$13 billion. Bill Broden of Hermitage Capital in Moscow says: "is a better deal than his friend Kordokovsky received for oil giant Yukos which is now worthless and has seen him end up in gaol. If sale of Gazprom had taken place on the open market the price would have been double with either Chinese or Indians buying it. But the Russian government did not want this".

In South Africa former mining company executive Brett Kebble has been shot dead while on the way to dinner. A major sponsor of Black Economic Empowerment he was recently forced to resign from the board of several companies.

Ben Sopit of GSM Association says they plan to connect 50% of world's population to mobile phones by year 2010. "We already have 25% of world's population with mobiles. Nokia and Motorola are both working on cheap handsets to enable this. Cheapest now sells for US\$25 per unit. One limiting factor to mobile usage is cost of top ups. In Philippines lowest top-up is for \$0.03. This increases the numbers now able to access mobiles".

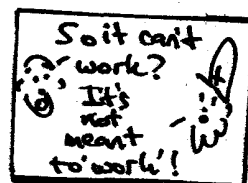
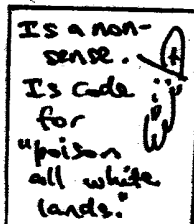
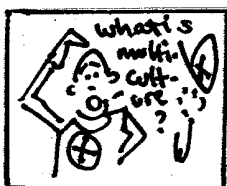

BBC World Service c/- SBS Radio 93.3 FM 'Business Report' 5.30am Friday 30 September 2005:

In Iraq today car bombs killed 60 people.

Reporter James Whittington, Istanbul: This year's British Presidency of EU has seen Turkey's entry put to the top of the agenda. A meeting next week will set a timetable for entry, despite attempts by Austria to push for something 'less' than full membership. Italy's FIAT car company are in the middle of a 500 million EURO plan to transfer all its small car manufacturing to its Turkish division, KOCH. Is being overseen by FIAT's Alfredo Atlavina: "we see Turkey as already part of the EU. 50% of its imports come from the EU. 50% of its exports go to the EU. From a business standpoint it already is part of the EU". [Then why bring it in? RE].

In Whitehall this week the British and Commonwealth Office is sponsoring a conference by Arab International Women's Forum. AIWF, run by Haifa Al Kilarni, promotes 'women as agents of change' in Muslim society.



N&INS Analysis: Australian 'Elections' Reach Third World Level:

'Elections' in Zimbabwe are not worthy of the name but Australia's own elections only get wackier by the moment. Do the public notice? Apparently not. So long as cricket, football and the Lotto are on the air they just sleep on.

Western Australia: In the 2005 Western Australian State elections ALP government was doomed. After only three years in office their typical Socialist, economic incompetence could no longer be disguised by the pro-Left controlled media. Due to gross economic mismanagement one commentator in *The Austral-alien* speculated WA State Liberal leader Barnett could "break the strangle-hold the ALP have on all states and territories" a fact that seems to have escaped the notice of the public. ALL six States and BOTH Territories. Is a record for any party but passes without comment in our media. Another proof these are not 'media' for information but distorting censors working with the System to keep us enslaved.

Federal Rule: ALP domination of the second tier of government is major reason why Latham's ALP lost 2004 Federal election. Australia's secret Masters see Federal Senate as useless as 'House of Review' given political party polarisation there mirroring Lower House, so replaced it with a State-Federal divide. Senate's original goal of 'House of Review' and 'State's House' was designed to balance natural 2/3 majority enjoyed by two largest states - NSW and Victoria. Has never worked as Senate replicates party divisions of Lower House.

State Senators: These show more allegiance to their Party than their State. Result is two identical, Party-ruled Houses. Our rulers, whoever they are, decided a better way would be to have the Federal sphere ruled by one party, so gave Howard's Liberals control of both Upper and Lower Houses in the 2004 elections to begin July 2005. But this 'power-sharing' deal means ALP get to rule all States as a counter-weight. Is like Saducee rule of temple balanced by Pharisee rule of every synagogue (Acts 23.6). In March 2005 WA Liberal leader Barnett threatened to topple this unofficial arrangement by winning the WA State election against the vastly unpopular and incompetent ALP government of Dr Gallop. Barnett knew the Plan so made a desperate effort in the final week of the election to snatch defeat from the jaws of victory. Barnett announced a scheme to pipe fresh water 1,900 miles from the Ord River Scheme across the deserts of Far North WA to the population base in its Southern cities. This billion dollar scheme was announced to the media but had not been 'costed'.

System Media Role: Controlled media sensed their chance. In a move strangely reminiscent of the 1998 Pauline Hanson 'flat tax' affair the media took the opportunity to paint Barnett as 'fiscally irresponsible'. Not a term the public understood but they knew it was not a good thing. They took the hint, that Barnett was an economic incompetent, too, so stuck to Gallop's ALP. Phew! La Balance was preserved. But System decided to send a message: it does not really value votes anymore. In a peculiar twist Gallop's party lost no seats. A widely unpopular leader of an incompetent government but the ALP lost only one seat but so did the Liberals. Status quo remained. Story gets stranger.

NSW & Israel: WA result was foreshadowed in NSW one year earlier. NSW had been due to go to polls in same week as Israeli elections and Geo Bush II entered Iraq. Ariel Sharon boasted to his electorate he had 'ordered' Bush into Iraq, therefore a vote for Sharon's Likud was only way to ensure Mid-East peace. Sydney is Australia's most populous city, financial capital and home to Australia's second largest Semite garrison. Is second only to Melbourne, our 'cultural capital'. By ruling these two cities garrison rules entire continent as together NSW and Victoria hold 2/3 of seats in Federal Parliament.

NSW & Iraq: Invasion of Iraq took all our rulers' efforts. No media space was wasted on something as insignificant as maintaining pretense of 'democracy' in far off NSW. So ALP government of Bob Carr, married to a Malay-Chinese, only lost three seats. But to ensure dozey public got message of Australia's relative unimportance in New World Order's 'big picture' Opposition Liberals also lost three seats. Carr's ALP were returned with same number of seats - just as in WA one year later.

Qld 'Elections': In late 2004, between NSW and WA 'elections', ALP-ruled Qld went to polls. Results differed in that ALP lost three seats. But in 2001 'landslide' ALP had one of the largest majority's in Qld Parliamentary history, 68 seats out of 89, so loss of three was negligible. As in WA the role of Murdoch-media was crucial. With our alien rulers tightening their grip soon even the pretense of 'democracy' will become a distant memory. Elections are a fraud and System does not care who notices as no one seems to care anymore, either. As if rigged State elections were not enough, in 2004 Qld reached a new low under ALP rule.

Local Gone, Too: One month before 28 March 2004 Local Government elections for Qld's 110 town, city and Shire Councils ALP government held a fake State 'election'. Media attention was so totally focused on getting Beattie returned to power they overlooked an important event in the democratic calendar: cut-off date for nominations for candidates in the LG elections fell on same day as Beattie's latest exercise in fraud. LG elections are our only fixed-term elections, unlike both State and Federal elections which are usually called at random by the ruling party whenever they think they have a good chance of winning. LG's are more democratic as governments cannot avoid them. Except this time, thanks to Beattie's media masters. Media maelstrom in lead-up to State election left no room for LG publicity. Consequently, few noticed cut-off date had come and gone - till the following week when it was too late. Result was over half Qld's councillors were 'returned unopposed'. Without any other candidate there was no election. Media response? Total silence. Even now 18 months afterwards no controlled media outlet has even mentioned the lack of elections. Democracy truly is dead.
