Reporter Bill Hattern: Interviews Viscount Etlenne Davinyon, Chair of Bilderberg Group, world's most infimential discussion group. Has been accused by Jim Tucker, editor of the American Free Press, of being 'pure evil'. VED denies this. Kase Van der Pile explains: "WWII saw many European exiles arrive in Britain. Some got together. They sought ways to re-shape the post-war world so as to avoid another war. The as-yet nameless discussion group held its first formal meeting in 1954 at the Hotel Bilderberg in Holland. Aim of that first meeting was to discuss the ramifications of the recent death of Joseph Stalin, for 26 years the absolute ruler of Russia and its satellites".

Will Hutton is a British newspaper editor who first attended a BG meeting in 1987."You get to meet first-hand those making the decisions - and you get to influence those decisions". VED agrees their decisions can 'shape' international events but denies they set formal 'action plans'. However, many attendees at BG meetings DO have action plans. KVDP sees BG "as a means for the 'elite' to reconcile their differences, although there is no chairman." VED says BG's current aims are "the promotion of Free Trade, WTO and Trans-Atlantic cooperation".

All world leaders attend just before they rise to power. Blair first appeared at a BG meeting two years before he became British Prime Minster. Bill Clinton arrived at BG while still governor of Arkansas. All current heads of the European Commission began attending BG meetings shortly before they were 'elevated'. VED rejects this as evidence of collusion claiming BG are "just good talent-spotters. We ask ourselves: 'who is up and coming?' Then we invite them along". Some say it is rather the BG get 'their men' elected to positions of power. VED refutes this: "BG is not a global ruling elite. There is NO global ruling elite!"

Will Hutton compares BG to Asia, where "personal relations are paramount". Whatever the truth, there are limits to BG's collective power. VED admits: "if we ARE a secret world government we should be thoroughly ashamed of ourselves, with the mess the world is in". KVDP: "BG members may be more powerful but are increasingly powerless".

Pakistani officials today retrieved many tons of missing Afghani coins after a recent 30 ton shipment from the Pakistani mint was found to be 21 tons lighter than it should be. They say they received the missing coins through a 'go-between'.

Now published in 20 languages including Chinese. [JC's book The Wild Swans sold 10 million copies. RE].

JC: "Mao is often referred to as 'just another Chinese emperor' but even by that standard he was their worst despot ever directly responsible for 70 million deaths. Even after millions had died in the Great Leap Forward (1958-59) he still wanted it to continue. He said 'for my program to succeed HALF the Chinese people may have to perish'. When peasants died he ordered them buried in the field, not in a graveyard, and then crops be planted over them. Why? 'Their deaths may still profit us by fertilizing the soil'. We conducted hundreds of personal interviews with Chinese in China and overseas. My husband [co-author Jon Halliday] is fluent in Russian. So he investigated the Soviet archives. There we uncovered many new facts.

For example, the Long March of 1935-36 [by Mao's People's Liberation Army] has been heavily mythologised by the Chinese Communist regime. The PLA allegedly fought many battles and suffered heroically. But we found this not to be true. In the Soviet archives we discovered direct correspondence between then Chinese President the Nationalist Chang Kai Shek and Joseph Stalin, the Communist dictator of Russia. President Chang had only one son and heir. And this son was being held hostage in Russia by Stalin's agents. Chang wrote to Stalin pleading for his son's release. These letters are still in the Soviet archives. We matched dates of allegedly PLA 'battles' on the Long March and they matched precisely with Stalin's responses to a letter from Chang. Precisely. It showed Chang had let the Red Army 'off the hook' on each occasion. He was clearly 'doing a deal' with Stalin for his son's release. Eventually Mao's PLA escaped entirely. When Stalin no longer needed to blackmail Chang he freed his son. This one son later succeeded him as President of the Republic of China after the Nationalists were defeated in 1949 and forced to flee the Mainland for Taiwan.

Another example of Mao's character is found in his un-official dairies. He describes how was visiting a small village one day when there was an execution. He saw Communists activists beating peasants to death. It effected him profoundly: 'That is when I became a Leninist!' He got a thrill from watching others executed. Later, when he had seized power, he would regularly purge many of his own loyal party members. He'd have their tortures filmed and then watch these in the comfort of his villa.

As for his office routines when ruler, he rarely got out of bed. Used to lie there all day reading official reports. So how did he rule so effectively? Mao was good at keeping a small band of followers, a tight inner circle, loyal. Then he'd ruled through these. Was good at choosing underlings. Like long-term Prime Minister, Chou En Lai, who represented China to the outside world.

Mao kept a tight lid on public opinion. There was no freedom. Even today the Chinese regime, using technology imported from the West, keeps track of all Web-sites. If a student, e.g., were to use a word like 'democracy' a warning appears on your screen against 'profane speech' ".

Federal Bureau of Investigation today announced arrest of Philippine agent Leondro Agricolacillo who had spied on the White House, first spy uncovered there in 100 years. A naturalised US citizen and former US Marine the agent began work at the White House in 1999. Three years later he transferred to FBI where he has been ever since. Charged with downloading and sending 100 'Top Secret' documents to Michael Aquino, who represented elements of Philippines Opposition planning a coup against President Gloria Arroyo. Aquino was arrested today in the Philippines. Former Philippines President Estrada, now under House arrest, admits meeting with Agricolacillo.

Speaking at National Endowment for Democracy in Washington US President George Bush says Iraq struggle is part of plan by 'Islamic militants' to establish a worldwide 'empire'. Accused Iran & Syria of supplying 'insurgent's' arms. British Prime Minister Tony Blair accused Iran of supplying Iraqi 'insurgents' with weaponry through Hezbollah organisation. Iraqi President Jalal Talabami agreed but his Prime Minister Al Jafaari rejects such claims. [In 1996 Neo-Cons presented a 'wish list' to US President Bill Clinton of countries they wanted overthrown for 'threatening Israel'. Top six were Iraq, Iran, Syria, Lebanon, Jordan and Egypt. In 2003 Blair & Bush conquered Iraq. In 2005 Bush agents killed former Lebanese Prime Minister Rafik Hariri and use his murder as excuse to eject all 40,000 Syrian Occupation troops from the country. Bush and Blair now target Syria directly by attempting to link Syria and Iran with Hezbollah. This pro-Iranian group spent 22 years chasing Israeli Army out of Lebanon. Israel never forgets. So why target the others? Egypt forced the Jews into slavery 3500 years ago as did Iraq did 2650 years ago. Syria under Ben Hadad attacked Israel during the time of King David as did Moab (Jordan). In Iraq 12 people have died from suicide bombers. Five oil ministry guards died in Kirkuk.

Italian Opposition Leader Romano Prodi has vowed to remove all of Italy's 3,000 troops from Iraq if elected.

Secretary General of NATO announced plans for 'several thousand' additional troops be sent to Afghanistan's South, an area of conflict where US troops are actively pursuing 'insurgents'. Agreed would be difficult to keep NATO troops separate from US effort even though NATO's 'peace-keepers' had no anti-insurgency agends. Suggested "maybe PRT's [provincial reconstruction teams] need combat training". Admitted NATO was under 'heavy pressure' from US to 'share the burden' of anti-Taliban actions but resistance from France, Germany and Spain prevents this. Germany has largest contingent in International Security Assistance Force with 2,500 troops.

[Open secret: US is short of troops. In 1992 Clinton was appointed President. US Army had 900,000 men. Since end of Cold War with Russia in 1989 the US Left, including Clinton's Democrats, had demanded 'a peace dividend' i.e. some 'pay off' for sacrifices undertaken during the 40 year-long war. When Clinton entered office in 1992 he began delivering the 'dividend' with massively increased funds for social welfare, the Democrats favourite method of rewarding their followers. But how to pay for it? With money from the military. As 'the war' was over, who needed men in uniform? Clinton began to de-mob the US armed forces and to close down & sell off army, air and naval bases. Is tempting to think your enemy will tire of bloodshed but they will not". Warned militants see Jordan and Egypt as 'easy targets' for overthrow.

European Union launched satellite Cryosat from a base in Northern Russia to measure shrinkage of polar ice-caps.

Suicide bomber in Iraq killed seven including a woman and her two children. Was an apparent ambush of a police patrol called out to answer a car accident report. Three police were killed and six wounded.

Reporter Grant Ferret: UN report criticises increasing number of breaches of arms embargo on Somalia as President and his rivals re-arm. Eight Yemeni Air Force flights recorded bringing arms to President's temporary capital. Weapons are also arriving from Ethiopia's government. Both say they are only 'aiding a legitimate government'.

Is alleged Morocco 'dumped' 500 Sub-Saharan Africans in desert over Algerian border following failed attempt to enter Spanish enclave of Melia and Cuita last week. Moroccan officials say they have detained 25, 000 such would-be immigrants in past five years and are "tired of being Europe's border guards".

British scientist believes he has found source of original BSE, or 'mad cow disease'. Decimated British beef industry in 1960's and its affects continue today. Found importation of 'animal bone meal' from India to British began at precisely same time. This bone meal was a cheap source of protein for British animal feed production, plastic's manufacture and gelatine for foods, both for animals and humans. Examining old Customs reports he found anomalies. The bone meal was classed as 'animal' but random Custom searches found one sack with large crab shells and a full head of female human hair. His research in India found a possible explanation.

Hindus regard river Ganges as Mother river, source of all life. All dead bodies, animal and human, are returned to it on death. River has become a vast sewer. 

Supremacist leaves legacy of hate

Aryan Nations founder saw movement splinter before his death

SEATTLE - Toward the end of his life, the man who was once the nation's most visible face of white supremacy, a Nazi-uniform-wear-ing, jackbooted ideologue whom his critics called "the grandfather of hate," was a frail old widower gasping for breath in a tiny donated house in northern Idaho.

And when he died in his sleep Wednesday at 86, Richard Butler, who founded the Aryan Nations in the 1970s, had already long ago lost his power and influence over the radical right, a collection of ex-tremist subcultures, militias and neo-Nazi offshoots that his movement spawned.
Still, the death of one of the

founders of the 20th century white separatist movement signals the end of a chapter in the nation's so-cial history. And it certainly marks the failure of Mr. Butler's ambition to create what he had envisioned as "an autonomous Arvan home land" in the Pacific Northwest.

"Butler's death, in a way, marks the end of an era," said Daniel Levitas, author of *The Terrorist* Next Door: The Militia Movement and the Radical Right. "But it cer tainly is not removing somebody from the scene who was actively playing a role of any great signifi-cance at the time of his death."

Mr. Butler's brand of white supremacy was based on a theology known as Christian Identity, combining a heretical interpretation of the Bible and a belief that Jews were Satanic and blacks "mud

Before the seams of that movement began to come apart, Mr. Butler's 20-acre compound in the pine-forested hills of northern Idaho was a gathering spot fo-

But Mr. Butler had become increasingly isolated.

Most experts agree that though white supremacy may be ebbing, it has certainly not died along with Mr. Butler. Indeed, there are signs on the Internet and in rallies that it may still be thriving, from Washington state to West Virginia, al-

though in new forms.

"Is the radical right in trouble, faltering and fading away?" said Mark Potok, who tracks extremist grour, for the Southern Poverty don't think so. I think it's yet again starting to morph."

Though it may have lost its dominance, Christian Identity is still strong within the white supremacy movement, particularly in the South. On the rise, experts say, are groups like one in Portland, Ore., called Volksfront, which says it champions whites' civil rights while rejecting racial violence

In the Pacific Northwest, a bastion of white separatism, anti-gova new dogma has begun to spread, drawing on Odinism, a pre-Chris-tian theology that features Norse deities and derives its name from the chiefgod, Odin.

Skinheads and other separatist groups who have rejected Chris-tian Identity are drawn to Odinism because it rids them of the messy problem of having to contend with Christian values like compassion and forgiveness and frees them to justify violence, said Randy Blazak, a professor of sociology at Portland State University and director of the university's Hate Crimes Research Network.

Mr. Blazak and other experts trace the rise of radical subcultures like Odinism to the turmoil in the white supremacy movement. For several years it has been riven by infighting, philosophical friction and fall-offs in recruitment.

Today there are about 17 Aryan Nations chapters across the country with a total of 200 or so members, figures that are a third to a half of what they were in the mid-80s, according to the South-ern Poverty Law Center.

"Americans in this day and age are not at all keen on the idea of being recruited into violent revolutionary organizations whose mission is to assassinate public officials," Mr. Levitas said. "It is not a very sellable idea in a post-9-11 world."
